

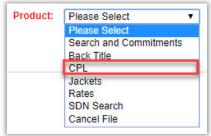




Closing Protection Letter - Generate in RamQuest

Learn how to generate a Closing Protection Letter (CPL) using the RamQuest/Closing Market Integration with AgentNet[®]. Always confirm file details are complete and accurate in your RamQuest file before selecting a Product.

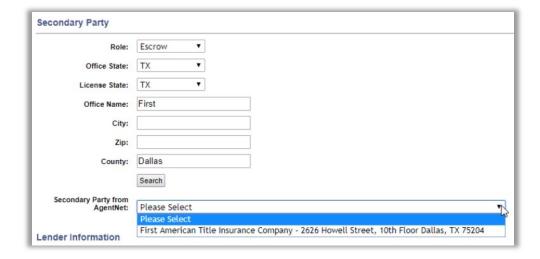
1. In the Closing Market window, from the Product dropdown list, select CPL



NOTE: The fields for the letter are populated. Required fields are highlighted in red. Change the **Letter Type**, **Covered Party**, optional **Secondary Party**, **Lender**, and **Attorney** Information as required.
